

Highlights

- The number of confirmed COVID-19 cases in Pakistan has risen to 3,864 as of 07 April. Increase of 687 new cases in the last 24 hours.
- The most affected province due to COVID-19 virus is Punjab 1,918, followed by Sindh 932.
- A 30 bedded isolation hospital with 5 Intensive Care Unit (ICU) beds and ventilators for COVID-19 patients have been established at Abdullah Hospital Skardu by Health Department Gilgit Baltistan.
- Six quarantine centers and two isolation wards have been established in district Kohistan, Khyber Pakhtunkhwa with a total bed capacity of 69.
- The capital administration extended the lockdown of the city for another eight days as the number of Covid-19 patients rose to 82 on Monday
- Chairman National Disaster Management Authority said on Monday that keeping in view the need of the country during the coronavirus pandemic, 2,000 additional ventilators would be sought from China.
- Pakistan opened its Torkham and Chaman border crossings on Monday to allow the exit of Afghan nationals until April 9.
- Chairman National Disaster Management Authority, in a briefing to a session of the parliamentary committee on Monday, said that there are more than 3,800 ventilators present in the country.
- The Punjab government has banned all kind of philanthropic and private relief activities to minimize violations of social distancing and to avoid further spread of the coronavirus (COVID-19).


